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## A Pastor's Eastertide Reflection on Being Church

There is something about spring time that lifts the soul. Perhaps it is warm sunny days. Maybe it is seeing the dogwood trees in bloom and flowers emerging from winter's deep sleep to reveal their radiant fresh colors. Or it might be the sight of song birds returning from their winter migration, singing their early morning songs to the glory of God. Whatever the reason, spring is a time filled with hope.

I think it no accident that we celebrate the resurrection of our Lord during the springtime. The seasons of Easter and spring seem to be a compliment to each other. With Christ rising from the tomb of death, we take hope that sin and death do not have a permanent choke hold on those who have chosen to accept God's gift of forgiveness by choosing to live in a committed relationship with the Lord and the body of Christ (the Church). St. Paul writes that if anyone is in Christ that person becomes a new creation (2 Corinthians 5:17). The old ways of living and being are let go of and a new way of life begins.

This new way of life doesn't always happen instantaneously (though for some it seems to happen in an instant, as with Saul's conversion on the way to Damascus as we read in Acts 9). For many people, embracing the new life Christ offers as the Risen Lord takes time. Jesus appeared before his disciples seven times in the gospels, and while they saw, and acknowledged him, it wasn't until Pentecost when the Spirit grabbed their spirits, that they translated their knowledge of Christ Risen into living as Resurrection people.

Sometimes churches, like people, can acknowledge that there is a God and that Jesus is their Risen Lord, but have trouble translating that awareness into a communal life that reflects a dynamic relationship with a living and Risen Christ. While some say the mainline church is a dying institution, I see signs of rebirth and new life here at Brick Presbyterian Church. I see evidence that the Spirit of God that was in the Risen Lord is moving about in the midst of our congregation.

Where is the evidence you may ask? It's in a growing involvement and growing relationship a number of our people have taken in ministering with the people of "Tent City." The signs of new life are seen in the emerging ministry known as the "House of Hope Café" coffee house ministry that seeks creative ways to celebrate Christ's love and reach out to others. One can look at how there are some new faces appearing in our midst at worship – at how we are willing to do new things in order to reach folk and invite them into a relationship with the Lord and the Body of Christ, as in our "Blessing of the Pets service." And let us not forget that we are seeking to share God's compassion in our worship services through the "Rite of Wholeness and Well-being" once each month as we seek to make worship and prayer more personal. These things and others give me reason to think that the Spirit of the Risen Lord is alive and at work in the life of Brick Presbyterian Church.

Being a church member is about more than belonging to an institution on paper. It's about being in a living relationship with the Risen Lord. It's about more than saying "I'm spiritual" or "I believe in God." It's about living under Christ's rule, submitting to service of the Risen Lord and being the Body of Christ in the world today.

"And we know that in all things God works for the good of those who love him, who have been called according to his purpose" (Romans 8:28-29).

## DID YOU KNOW????



...that the money we donate to “Blankets Plus” does make a positive difference? The bible verse for 2012 Blanket Sunday is from Psalm 46: “God is our refuge and strength, a very present help in trouble.”

What difference does a blanket make? Read the following by Sherry L. Byrnes:

“Being alone and wishing for security, Blanket, you are our comforter  
Living hard, no home of our own, Blanket, you are our carpet, our towel, our tablecloth,  
and our cushion.

Aching with fear and cold, Blanket, you are our warmth, our coat, our cover.

Needing privacy, Blanket, you are our wall, our curtain, our shade.

Knowing I can only take what I carry, Blanket, you are my carrier, my travel companion,  
my helper.

Evening time, black night settles on my shoulders. Blanket, you are our shelter, our  
safety.

Trusting – there are many who care, whose gifts travel far.

Blanket, you are our lifeline to the Lord and the people whose love you send.

For over 60 years, Church World Service workers have provided emergency supplies of blankets, tools, and food to disaster-struck areas, tools and seeds to replant fields, wells to provide clean, safe water to drink and irrigate crops. By sharing our resources we make a difference in the lives of others. The impact of CWS was felt in the state of Washington where blankets were distributed to a homeless men’s shelter in Seattle. The village of Mwingi in Kenya also felt the impact by receiving safe drinking and irrigation water.

To make your gift more personal, you will have the opportunity for your monetary gift to be in honor or in memory of a loved one. A table will be provided in the narthex on two Sundays, May 6 and 13, where you may obtain a card which may be sent to the person or families that you are honoring. As usual, envelopes will be provided in the bulletin and pews for your use when the offering is received on May 13, Mother’s Day. Since this is personal for each family, a list of names will not be printed in the newsletter or bulletin.

In 2011, you, the members and friends of Brick Presbyterian Church, contributed \$807.52 to this program. We ask you to pray and give as generously as you are able. Please be aware that \$5 will provide a blanket for a child, \$25 will provide 5 blankets for a homeless family. “Let’s blanket the world with love.”

## Tdap VACCINATIONS

Because the Ocean County Health Department (OCHD) has seen an increase in cases of whooping cough in our area, they have made available this vaccine. Tdap is a combination of three vaccines that protect against tetanus, diphtheria, and pertussis (whooping cough). Even if someone has had a Td booster (tetanus and diphtheria, usually given every 10 years) recently, they may be vaccinated with the Tdap to give them protection against whooping cough. The OCHD recommends at this time, if one has received the Tdap vaccination in their lifetime, they may not receive another. Persons need to receive their Tetanus booster every 10 years.



It is *important* for parents, grandparents, and healthcare workers to receive one dose of Tdap to protect themselves and any children in which they may be in contact. Not only are adults at risk for contracting whooping cough, they have the opportunity to pass the disease to infants and children who may not be fully immunized.

### **Recommendations from the Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices (ACIP)**

- All adults, including those over the age of 65, should receive a Td (tetanus/diphtheria ) booster every 10 yrs
- Adults under the age of 65, who have never received a Tdap, should receive this for their next booster dose.
- All adults, including those over the age of 65, who have or who anticipate having close contact with an infant less than 12 months of age and who have not received the Tdap booster vaccine, should receive a single dose of Tdap to protect against pertussis and reduce the likelihood of transmission.
- Adults over the age of 65 may also receive one dose of Tdap instead of Td if they have not previously received this vaccine.
- Any adult who wants to be protected from pertussis should receive this booster.
- New mothers who have never received a Tdap vaccine should get a dose as soon as possible after delivery.

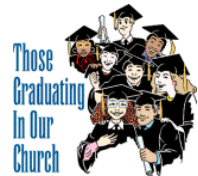
