A man went in for his annual checkup and received a phone call from his physician a couple of days later.

The doctor said, "I'm afraid I have some bad news for you."

"What's the news?" the man asked. "Well, you have only 48 hours to live."

"That is bad news!" said the shocked patient.

" I'm afraid I have even worse news," the doctor continued.

"What could be worse than what you've already told me?" the patient stammered.

"I've been trying to call you since yesterday."

Communication today, even with amazing technology at our fingertips, can still be challenging. I and your church leadership continue to seek ways to communicate effectively with you. This currently includes Announcements in Worship, the newsletter, text messages, phone calls, face-to-face (is this getting rarer?), and email. We have been using Constant Contact as a way of creating beautiful emails that incorporate color and pictures. Despite all these methods, people don't seem to be much better at communicating!

In an effort to continue improving communication, the church now has a program called **Breeze**. Breeze is an intuitive web-based church management software that helps churches like ours with data management, calendar organization, stewardship assessment, and communication.

Beginning this month, you may see **emails** from me (Kristie) with the following address: pastorkristiemiles\_rt+gmail@breezechms.com . I will also still use my standard PastorKristieMiles@gmail.com address.

We are also able to send **texts** to you using Breeze if you have a smartphone. Any message from our Breeze account will come from this number: **874-47.** 

If you get an email that says it's from me but it is from an address <u>other</u> <u>than</u> either <u>pastorkristiemiles\_rt+gmail@breezechms.com</u> or <u>PastorKristieMiles@gmail.com</u>, it is probably a phishing scam. Do not open it. Report it and delete it. If it asks for money, gift cards, or a "favor," rest assured it is not from me.

Likewise, if you get a text message from a number <u>other than</u> my personal cell phone 434-610-4032 or our Breeze text number 874-47, then do not open it. Report it and delete it. It makes me sad that Jesus' words are just as true today as they were in his time: "I am sending you out like sheep into the midst of wolves, **so be wise as serpents and innocent as doves.**" (Matthew 10:16). Together we can be effective and safe communicators.

In the midst of all of our communication, may we never forget the most important conversation we should be having every day: prayer – which is absolutely a two-way communication with God! I hope that you are taking advantage of our ever-present Creator who loves you, wants to hear from you, and is speaking to you.

John Ortberg wrote about the power of prayer in his book <u>The Life You've Always Wanted</u>:

"One of my favorite stories about intercessory prayer comes from Tony Campolo. A prayer meeting was held for him just before he spoke at a Pentecostal college chapel service. Eight men took Tony to a back room of the chapel, had him kneel, laid their hands on his head, and began to pray. That's a good thing, Tony wrote, except that they prayed a long time, and the longer they prayed, the more tired they got, and the more tired they got, the more they leaned on his head. "I want to tell you that when eight guys are leaning on your head, it doesn't feel so good."

"To make matters worse, one of the men was not even praying for Tony. He went on and on praying for somebody named Charlie Stoltzfus: "Dear Lord, you know Charlie Stoltzfus. He lives in that silver trailer down the road a mile. You know the trailer Lord, just down the road on the righthand side." (Tony said he wanted to inform the pray-er that it was not necessary to furnish God with directional material.) "Lord, Charlie told me this morning he's going to leave his wife and three kids. Step in and do something, God. Bring that family back together."

"Tony writes that he finally got the Pentecostal preachers off his head, delivered his message, and got in his car to drive home. As he drove onto the Pennsylvania Turnpike, he noticed a hitchhiker. I'll let him tell it from here:

"We drove a few minutes and I said, "Hi, my name's Tony Campolo. What's yours?" He said, "My name is Charlie Stoltzfus." I couldn't believe it!

"I got off the turnpike at the next exit and headed back. He got a bit uneasy with that and after a few minutes he said, "Hey mister, where are you taking me?" I said, "I'm taking you home." He narrowed his eyes and asked, "Why?"

"I said, "Because you just left your wife and three kids, right?" That blew him away. "Yeah! Yeah, that's right." With shock written all over his face, he plastered himself against the car door and never took his eyes off me.

"Then I really did him in as I drove right to his silver trailer. When I pulled up, his eyes seemed to bulge as he asked, "How did you know that I lived here?" I said, "God told me." (I believe God did tell me) ...

"When he opened the trailer door his wife exclaimed, "You're back! You're back!" He whispered in her ear and the more he talked, the bigger her eyes got.

"Then I said with real authority, "The two of you sit down. I'm going to talk and you two are going to listen!" Man, did they listen! ... That afternoon I led those two young people to Jesus Christ."
