- Walk into many stores during the month of August and you will find displays full of new backpacks, new shoes, and new schoolwork organizers.
- Just yesterday I heard the news that two of our church kids will be in the same class together with a beloved teacher.
- Another student told me that they love the feeling of having a "fresh clean slate" at the beginning of the school year.

On **Sunday, September 17**, Brick Presbyterian Church is also going to do some new things. **Christian Education will be held at 9:00 AM** every Sunday *for all ages!* I am very excited about what we are going to be able to do and learn together! Worship will continue to be held at 10:00 AM.

Here's our teacher line-up:

Pre-Kindergarten – 2nd Grade: Joan Horan in Room 2;

3rd – 5th Grade: Jill Moberg in Room 3; 6th – 8th Grade: Lorrie Haluza in Room 4;

9th - 12th Grade: Pastor Kristie in the upstairs Youth Room;

Adult Class: Rev. Brian Miles in the Parlor.

All classes will be using the Feasting on the Word curriculum. This curriculum will follow the lectionary (the prescribed Scripture readings for each Sunday) so every age level will be studying the same Bible passages. Of course, the specific lessons are developmentally appropriate.

The nursery has been moved from classroom 4 to classroom 1, utilizing a bigger room to accommodate the youngest children in our midst and bring them closer to the sanctuary.

Why the change?

There are some practical and some theological reasons for making this change. By conducting Christian Education at a time other than the worship hour, we will:

• Enable teachers to attend worship to nurture their own spiritual growth.

- Maximize the pool of willing Church School teachers by eliminating the need to choose between attending worship or Church School.
- Christian Education is for everyone! There is no graduation from learning more about Scripture, God, and spiritual development & nurture.
- Enable the entire Body of Christ to worship together. Kids can and should be in worship. They will continue to learn about their faith as they watch and participate with the adults. Every baptized person will be able to partake in Communion. When the children and youth are in worship, this can provide an opportunity for further family discussion and spiritual development at home.
- Enable the Session and the Pastor to fulfill our obligation to participate, support, and oversee the Christian Education program: "The session is responsible for the development and supervision of the church's educational programs, the instruction of ruling elders and deacons, and the discipleship of all members. The minister of the Word and Sacrament contributes to the nurture of the community through the ministries of Word and Sacrament, church school classes, the gift of prayer, and by example." (From our Book of Order W-5.0203, p. 118, 2023-2025 edition):
- Most importantly, our Constitution states in the Book of Order W-5.0203 (p. 119, 2023-2025 edition): "The central occasion for Christian nurture is the Service for the Lord's Day, where the Word is proclaimed and the Sacraments are celebrated. Beyond the process of Christian formation that takes place in public worship, the words and actions of the service can be a particularly fruitful source of study and reflection. Therefore, all members should be encouraged to be present and participate in this assembly. Educational activities should not be scheduled so as to prevent or discourage participation in this service" [the bold is my emphasis.] "...Worship in the church school is not a substitute for participation with the whole congregation in the Service for the Lord's Day."

I know that this will take some getting used to. This change has come after much, much prayer by me your Pastor, by the Session, and by the Christian Education Committee.

I recognize that there was an era when Sunday morning was culturally sacred, and competing events were not scheduled at that time. Slowly, competition for our time and attention on Sunday morning has grown. But I am convinced (and I hope you will be too) that by capitulating to the demands of culture on our time and attention, and thereby minimizing church worship and Christian Education opportunities, we are silently giving up the place, importance, and relevance that Church still has in people's lives today (can I get an Amen?). The more we give in to other demands on time and attention, the less influence the Gospel will have. We will "accommodate" ourselves into the relics of history.

If you have questions or concerns, please do not hesitate to call me or schedule a visit. I want to hear you and I promise that I respect your individual concerns. I will work to make Christian Education and Worship available to everyone in a way that is fulfilling. I am here to nurture and support your faith; most importantly, we are all here to be servants of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. May we all, in all we do, glorify beloved God.

RISE AGAINST HUNGER UPDATE



Awesome news! *The Rise Against Hunger Meals* we packaged on May 7 are now headed to Madagascar!

Madagascar, an island nation off the southeastern coast of Africa, is home to over 28 million people. The nation faces high rates of poverty, food insecurity and chronic malnutrition. Especially in the southern part of the country, low access to education, water scarcity and frequent natural disasters cause severe food insecurity. The Global Hunger Index, which assesses food insecurity based on indicators that measure undernourishment and undernutrition, categorizes Madagascar as having an "alarming" level of hunger.

Your impact: To address some of the food security challenges that children, families, and communities in Madagascar face, Rise Against Hunger partners with organizations that support educational programs by providing meals to children at schools and early childhood development centers. This is a key part of Rise Against Hunger's Nourishing Lives pathway. In some cases, the food children receive at school will be the majority of the food they eat in a day. The meals we packaged will help ensure that children have access to the consistent nourishment they need to live healthy lives and successfully pursue their education.

LARRY'S HOME



Throughout this calendar year, a number of activities at our church have generated donations which will be dedicated for the construction of Larry's Home. We were provided with the following information regarding this special project.

Just Believe Inc. Introduces Larry's Home, A Transitional Housing Facility

What to expect at Larry's Home:

Our transitional living program will be designed to support individuals struggling with homelessness and assist them in overcoming any barriers in reentering community living. Larry's Home will welcome 6 to 8 men (veterans receive first priority) in accordance with the requirements of the New Jersey Department of Community Affairs, state, county, and local government requirements. Each of our guests will have a roommate. In this regard, the men will not be required to pay rent to stay at Larry's Home. Opportunities to sponsor guests by the public will be available. Furthermore, the guests will be allowed to stay for up to 12 months and everyone will be taught life skills. Our guests will also be required to attend group meetings and have jobs or income to help secure permanent housing. We will assist our guests in finding gainful employment and Just Believe Inc. will create volunteer and employment opportunities for our guests. Larry's Home program will offer residents safe and stable living accommodations with the goal of fully rehabilitating our guests so they can reenter society.

A Word About Avoiding Scams

The Bible has quite a bit to say about Fraud and Scams. For instance, Proverb 20:17 says, "Bread gained by deceit tastes sweet, but the aftertaste is like a mouth full of gravel."

Today's world seems to be full of scammers, ready to take advantage of our generosity, trust, and ever-changing digital communication. This means that we must remain vigilant and informed.

I came across two articles about how to protect yourself from scams. The first is from the New Jersey Division of Consumer Affairs, specifically addressing how to protect ourselves from scams related to the Maui fire. They suggest researching a donation-seeking charity by checking their website (see below). I also recommend looking at CharityNavigator.org any time you are thinking about making a donation to anyone.

The second article published by Reader's Digest (I have included it here in full) stood out to me since scammers have, in the past, used my name in an illegitimate email using the phrase, "Do me a favor...." If you ever receive an email that looks like it is from me that asks for gift cards or a monetary "favor," please call me to either confirm its legitimacy or warn me of a scam.

If Someone Asks You to "Do Me a Favor" Over Email, Don't Respond

Here's everything you need to know to avoid falling for the "Can you do me a favor?" scam.

We'll be the first to admit that online scams can easily be mistaken for something real. That's why it's essential to know all the main ones circulating so you can identify them if they cross your path. For example, one of the top recurring online scams is the "Can you do me a favor?" scam. **Here's everything you need to know to protect yourself from this hoax.**

What is the "Can you do me a favor?" scam?

The scam works like this: You might receive an email from someone you think you know mentioning how busy they are and that they need to buy a gift card. Here's where it gets tricky: They'll typically say the gift card is for a feel-good cause, such as a charity. From there, the hacker will request that you purchase the gift card, send a picture of both sides and they'll reimburse you later. But, as you might have guessed, no "feel good" organization benefits from your purchase.

This scam works because hackers attempt to make it seem like they're someone you know. They might do that by signing the email with your name or using a similar address to that of your friends, coworkers or loved ones.

Unlike other online hoaxes, the "do me a favor" scam involves gift cards. Scammers often use gift cards as they are tricky to trace and hackers attempting to take your money can instantly download the funds. While people might be wary of sharing their bank account information, many wouldn't think twice about sending a gift card, which is why this scam is worrisome.

How can I keep this from happening to me?

Online scams are scary, but there are several steps you can take to ensure you do not get caught in the "do me a favor" scam trap. Here are four ways to ensure this does not happen to you.

Reach out directly to the person who supposedly sent it.

The most foolproof way to avoid falling into the "do me a favor" scam is by simply reaching out directly to the person who supposedly sent it. Usually, the scammers want you to believe it's someone you know who needs the money, so they might pose as your friend, relative or coworker. Therefore, the best way to avoid online scams is by contacting the supposed sender via phone or text message and checking in.

Take note of the email tone.

Another way to ensure you do not fall victim to the "Can you do me a favor?" scam is by considering the email's tone for context. Is the sender rushing you or making it sound urgent? If so, you'll want to double-check to ensure it's the real deal. You might also see phrases such as "I need it now."

Check the email address validity.

Another way to catch a scammer is by checking the email address's validity. Sometimes it will be just one or two numbers or letters off from the email address of someone you know, so give the address a thorough inspection.

Be mindful of who you give your email address to.

You know what they say: an ounce of prevention is worth a pound of cure. So with that in mind, be careful to whom you give your email address. Your email address is valuable information, and you want it to stay in the right hands.

Now that you're armed with this knowledge about the "do me a favor" scam, you're better prepared if you come up against it. Keep in mind, of course, that email is just one place you can encounter scams. You should also watch out for phone scams, Instagram scams, and even Facebook scams.
