Just as the eyes of Jesus' disciples were opened in wonder at the presence of their resurrected and living Lord, may our eyes be opened with wonder at how God is present here and at work within us, and in the church, and in the world.

And may we all be nourished and strengthened for the journey with the bread of heaven and the cup of salvation.

#### **COMMUNION**

## Let us pray:

- L: Almighty God, the whole world appears in turmoil with floods, fire, earthquakes and drought; institutions are being demeaned and dismantled; people are blaming and fighting with each other, and war, hunger and poverty persist.
- P: Help us to trust that you are at work, O God, bringing order to the chaos, and reshaping broken systems with the power that flows from Christ's resurrection.
- L: Patient God, change is difficult for us. We do not like uncertainty. We do not like feeling vulnerable. We do not like being unable to do all of the things we used to do.
- P: Hear our prayers, O God, and take our fear and sorrow into your peace. Grant us patience and trust that you are with us.
- L: Merciful God, we believe that you laugh with those who laugh, and cry with those who cry. May your tears bring comfort and healing to all who are ill in body, mind or spirit.

- P: May your presence give strength and hope to all who love and care for those who are ill.
- L: May your laughter remind us that, with you, O God, all things are possible.
- P: Hear us now as we silently lift up to you the names of people, places and concerns that weigh heavy on our heart. (silent prayer)
- L: Grant world leaders and all of us wisdom, humility, and vision, that we may join your work in bringing healing and hope to the world.

Gracious God, pour out your Holy Spirit upon us and upon these, your gifts of bread and wine, that the bread we break and the cup we bless may be the communion of the body and blood of Christ.

We remember that on the night that Jesus was betrayed, he took bread, and after giving thanks, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, saying: Take, eat. This is my body, given for you. Do this is remembrance of me.

In the name way, he took the cup, saying: This cup is the new covenant sealed in my blood, shed for you for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this in remembrance of me.

For as often as you eat this bread and drink this cup you proclaim the saving death of our risen Lord. The gifts of God for the people of God.

You are invited to come forward to receive the Communion elements from one of the stations at the front of the sanctuary.

The servers will hand the elements to you. Gluten-Free and Regular premade, sealed Communion elements are available from the server in the aisle and for those who remain in their seats.

The Bread of Heaven; Thanks be to God.

The Cup of Salvation; **Amen**.

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name. Thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread; and forgive us our debts, as we forgive our debtors; and lead us not into temptation but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom and the power and the glory, forever. Amen.
