# **DEACONS CORNER**

The love of our lord is ever present in the deeds of the Deacons of Brick Presbyterian church thanks to the devotion and support of our congregation.

In November the Deacons received roughly 1,489 lbs of food from generous donations from our parishioners, the Boy Scouts, Brick Elks, Cherry Quay Association, and Brick Schools. These generous donations were used to supply food to 30 families weekly at our Food Pantry.

In January the Deacons prepared 40 boxes of food for families of students in the Brick Township School District and 19 boxes for families of students at Ladacin. Additionally, each family was given a \$25 Shoprite gift card. The Deacons wanted to make sure these families had a little something extra after the excitement of the holiday season passed. This was a massive undertaking and was only possible thanks to the generosity of our church.

As we build the food pantry back up after the holidays the Deacons Food Pantry wish lists include:

- Soups: cream of chicken and chicken broth
- Canned Goods: canned chili, spam, baked beans, yams, potatoes, chickpeas and fruit
- **Packaged Goods:** brownie mix, cake mix, cornbread mix, mashed potatoes, ramen noodles, crackers and granola bars
- Dog/Cat Food: (small Portions)
- Beverages: coffee

Thank you to everyone who purchased a *Bloomin' 4 Good Bouquet from Stop & Shop* in January. Your purchase helped the Brick Presbyterian Church feed those in need in our community. For every bouquet you purchased, the Deacons received \$1 to be put towards the food pantry.

As the primary source of funding for the Office of the General Assembly (OGA), it is how Presbyterians mutually and equitably share the costs of moving the church forward in the 21st century.
