

CALL TO RELEASE

Christian Education Update from Lauren

Another year of Sunday School is upon us. I am so excited to be kicking off this year as the Christian Education Leader. As I settle into this new role, I cannot wait to shake things up and make Sunday School bigger and better than it ever was before. This year is going to look a little different than those that came before us. We are still going to hold Sunday School at 9am (*for all ages, k-12*). However, we are also bringing back Sunday School during the 10am worship for any students in grades k-3.

All Sunday School students be called at 9am to the FLC. We will begin the morning with coffee/light refreshments and family spiritual practices such as bible time, prayer journal, gratitude jar, etc. Families of the students are more than welcome to join us during this time, and then they may enjoy some fellowship with the other families/adults while the students move on to their next activity. Students will then participate in Story Telling/Christian Action. The content of these activities will depend on the themes during that time of year. For example, from mid-October to December, the students will primarily be working on their Christmas Pageant performances (scheduled to happen the morning of Sunday, December 8th). There will be several major units throughout the year that will each end in some sort of presentation for the congregation to show off everyone's knowledge and hard work. We also intend on having guest speakers come in on certain Sundays throughout the year to teach our students about our church and how it runs.

When it is time for worship at 10am, everyone will be encouraged to attend the service and children's moment. After the children's moment, students in grades k-3 will depart to their Sunday School class for a lesson and action relating to the lectionary. Students in 4th grade or above will remain in worship with activities relating to the sermon or lectionary scripture reading of the day. Students that turn in their completed activities outside the sanctuary after worship may receive a prize!

Doesn't all of this sound fun for both you and your kids?! Fellowship, food, and Christian Education - how much better can it get? **Registration for the 2024-2025 Sunday School year is now open, and** *Registration forms are in the Narthex*.

The first day of Sunday School will be September 29th. We will be hosting a pancake breakfast at 9am on September 22nd, to meet the teachers and students while we discuss the Sunday School calendar for the next three months.
