Welcome Adebisi A. Shofu, also known as Bisi Shofu

Adebisi (who is commonly referred to as Bisi) is a member of Westminster Presbyterian Church, Trenton and the 2024 Moderator of Coastlands Presbytery. She is a pulpit supply preacher who preaches in churches of the Presbytery.

She runs a Non-profit working with Children, Youth and Women and helping Non-profits raise funding. She serves on the Racial Equity Advocacy Committee (REAC) of the Office of the General Assembly of the Presbyterian Church, USA (PCUSA) and serves as liaison to the Mission Responsibility Through Investment (MRTI) a General Assembly Committee; as well as National Council of Churches (NCC) representing PCUSA. She has served on other commissions for the General Assembly.

She graduated from New Brunswick Theological Seminary, New Brunswick, New Jersey with an MDiv. Adebisi serves as an advocate for her community as well as a counselor. She serves as Chaplain at Skilled Nursing Facilities across New Jersey and has preached in many churches in the Presbytery as well as other denominations.

Adebisi is Presbyterian Disaster Assistance (PDA) Disaster Preparedness Trainer whose responsibility is to educate churches and congregations on planning ahead to mitigate disasters. She specializes in educating people about health insurance programs, diversity training and self-help training. She has served her Presbytery in multiple capacities

She was the Visiting Chaplain for New Brunswick Presbyterian Church (NBPC). Adebisi is the immediate past Moderator of Presbyterian Women in New Brunswick Presbytery (PWNBP) and the Moderator of Presbyterian Women in the Synod of the Northeast.
