Dear Friends,

I wonder if it might not be better to approach this season with more of a "free range" timelessness, mixing Advent preparation events with Christmas celebration events; mixing the promise of Emmanuel coming and the reality of the child sleeping in the manger together in our prayers and gatherings. And all of it happening, whenever and wherever it may occur.

Imagine the possibilities!

We can think about the shepherds on a Tuesday morning in early December, wonder about Joseph's choices on a random Friday afternoon, and spiritually join the faithful journey of the Magi on any night where a star seems to be begging to be noticed.

We can watch the parables of "It's a Wonderful Life" and "A Charlie Brown Christmas" and "Christmas with the Kranks" and "Christmas Vacation" and "The Grinch Who Stole Christmas" and recognize the characters who remind us of our families and our friends and even ourselves and the reason we are doing all of the wonderful, crazy stuff of this season!

We can see a hundred or more versions of Charles Dickens' "Christmas Carol" and measure our own Christmases - past, present and yet-to-be - and give thanks for those with whom we once celebrated, wonder about those who are are still unmet in our futures and, most significantly, love those who share our joys and our lives this year.

I hope that you will blend worship into your Advent/Christmas spiritual stew this year. If worship has slipped off of your "To Do" list, as it has for many in these post-Covid years, maybe this December would be a good time to come back home, over these coming weeks, to rest your souls in the familiar songs and stories to feel the warmth that you once knew so well. And I look forward to seeing you there.


Elvis has now left my Alexa device, and I am listening to Anne Murray singing:

## **Hymnal Dedications and Memorial Bricks**



# "God is our refuge and strength... Therefore, we will not fear, though the waters roar and foam." Psalm 46

As we see the catastrophic impacts Category 5 Hurricane Melissa made as it tore its path through Jamaica and across Cuba, we are praying for our siblings in the Caribbean. With maximum sustained winds of 185 miles per hour at landfall in October, authorities are calling this one of the most powerful storms ever to hit the region. Its smaller remnant continued to inflict damage among island nations in its path, and it will take years to recover.

Presbyterian Disaster Assistance (PDA) is providing grants to address urgent, immediate needs and will remain to address long-term recovery and unmet needs. The magnitude of this storm will require the development of long-term projects and assistance for both physical and emotional long-lasting effects.

PDA affirms our commitment to accompany those affected by this disaster. As people of God, once again we are called to bridge the "GAP" — Give, Act and Pray.

Financial support for relief efforts can be made to our church. Checks should have the notation "Hurricane Melissa" written on the memo line. Online donations should be designated for Hurricane Melissa. Donations made to our church for this cause will be forwarded to PDA.

### CHRISTMAS JOY OFFERING



When Jesus was born among us, he came as a helpless baby destined to bring joy, peace, and salvation to his people. This child, God's Word made flesh — fully human and fully God — became one of us. One with us. One among us. In all of our vulnerabilities, struggles and triumphs, Jesus became one of us —leading us, knowing us, connecting us to himself and to each other, and offering us his gift of eternal life.

#### The perfect gift.

Through the Christmas Joy Offering, we reflect God's perfect gift to us, with generous support of church leaders among us — past, present, and future — who have pointed us to God. We honor and celebrate leaders like retired pastors, church workers and their families who have faithfully guided and led us but who now find themselves in critical financial need. \$1.1 million of gifts from the 2024 Offering are being used to provide critical financial support and grants for current and retired Presbyter church workers in their times of need. Income supplements from the Board of Pensions (BOP) helped nearly 261 individual recipients, assisting retired church workers and surviving spouses with the means to provide for themselves. Housing supplements from the BOP helped more than 1,366 individual recipients remain in their homes, afford assisted living, or long-term care. Emergency Assistance Grants from the BOP helped more than 199 individual recipients facing times of great financial need or uncertainty due to unforeseen circumstances.

We also honor and celebrate emerging leaders like students in schools and colleges equipping communities of color, who develop leadership skills as they pursue their education and prepare to bring their gifts in service to the world God loves so much. More than \$800,000 of gifts from 2024 are being used to provide education and leadership development skills at Presbyterian-related schools and colleges equipping communities of color. Many of the students attending these schools and colleges are the first in their families to enroll in higher education.

Jesus' example as a child born to be among us and lead us to eternal life provides a pattern for us to follow as we celebrate those who have led us in the past and will lead us into the future. Through the Christmas Joy Offering we come together to support past, present, and future leaders, embodying God's perfect gift to us, Jesus Christ.


