**THE SACRAMENT OF HOLY COMMUNION**

*The Advent Communion Litany*

Beloved in the Lord, the holy Supper which we are about to celebrate is a three-fold feast: a feast of Remembrance, a feast of Communion and a feast of Hope.

**We come to Remember, especially in this season, that our Lord was sent to live a fully human life, fulfilling for our sake all of the demands of the law, so that we, by faith, are saved.**

From the loneliness of life, we are rescued by the life that Christ lived and the words he used to call us to share his yoke, to do his work, to love his family.

**We come to have communion with that same Christ who has promised that he will be with us always and has extended our faith beyond the boundaries of family, race, nation and gender, so that we might see and support him in "all the world."**

With Christ's presence in our lives, we can lay down our anxiety and stress as we discover the sacred gift of Shalom, which brings completeness to our lives.

**We come in Hope, knowing and believing that the day will come when all of the jealousy and hostility will be transformed into generosity and harmony in the full presence of God.**

This table is not ours, it belongs to our faithful Savior, on his behalf and in his name, we welcome all those who are a part of the Church, in any of its many forms. We come in awe and humility, for the love that is freely offered here unites us with each other and with God.

Let us lift up our hearts unto the Lord.

**Allow us, O God, to make room in our homes and in our hearts for your entry into our lives; teach us to be ready where we work, study, play and live. We ask you to startle and challenge us into action on your behalf. Free us from the fears that prevent us from hearing or speaking the Good News, at our jobs, in our families and as your Church. Motivate us to respond to your love and make us eager to journey to Bethlehem, so that we might discover your will for us. Amen.**

### **A Note from the Food Pantry**


Dear BPC Community,

We're immensely grateful for the thousands of pounds of donations that have filled our food pantry. **Your support is incredible!**


Given the current volume, we kindly request a **temporary pause** on new donations to allow our volunteers time to sort and stock.
